The Great Route of Bussaco is a linear, star-shaped trail, totalling 56 km, with three separate branches, centred on the Bussaco National Forest. The branches consist of the sections Mealhada - Bussaco (12 km), Mortágua - Bussaco (21 km) and Penacova - Bussaco (23 km). This route, sponsored by CIM-RC, extends through the municipalities of Mealhada, Penacova and Mortágua and highlights the area's natural potential based on the exuberant biodiversity of the Bussaco National Forest.

The Bussaco National Forest is a space of rare beauty and rich biodiversity, a true oasis in the Central Region for lovers of nature tourism, with one of the best collections of tree species in Europe. With 105 ha and about 550 metres above sea-level, the Bussaco National Forest, part of the Mediterranean Biogeographical Region, is strongly influenced by the Atlantic. This gives it a microclimate conducive to the development of an extraordinarily diverse flora and fauna due to mild temperatures, high rainfall and frequent morning mists. This climatic mix, together with the differences in solar exposure on its slopes, allows visitors to enjoy a typically Mediterranean evergreen vegetation (southern slope) and deciduous vegetation typical of temperate climates (north slope).

Within this exuberant green spot, comprising four landscape areas, the Arboretum (about 65 % of the forest's area), the Gardens and the Valley of Ferns, the Pinhal do Marquês pinewood and the relic Native Forest (Mock Privet Forest or Adernal), a large number of remarkable trees stand out. Also worthy of note are the Palace Hotel do Bussaco (a 19th-century Neo-Manueline building), with its "Jardim Novo" garden; the Stations of the Cross, the only one in the world built on the same scale as in Jerusalem, 3 km long and with 20 stations (Arrest and Passion of Christ); the Santa Cruz Convent, dating from 1628; the Military Museum; the monument commemorating the Battle of Bussaco; the viewpoints, especially the one at Cruz Alta (550m); and others.

For the traveller, the high point of this great route in the Bussaco National Forest is the discovery of a region from one of three different perspectives, depending on which branch is taken. If you choose Mealhada - Bussaco, enjoy the vineyards of Bairrada and discover the cellars where the red, white and sparkling wines are produced. The sparkling wine is much appreciated as an accompaniment to the most typical local delicacy - Bairrada roast suckling pig. Also on this route, discover the town of Luso, known for its







In the Mortágua-Bussaco section, the tourist is invited to walk through stums and villages, whom tell stories of napoleonic troops passing through the territory, but also, enjoy a faunistic and floristic diversity, provided by the streams found along the way.

The Penacova - Mealhada route allows travellers to discover something different, the mountain landscape of the Serra do Bussaco range.
